Villa Maria Academy, a Catholic college preparatory school for girls, rooted in the charism of the Sisters, Servants of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, empowers young women to lead lives of spiritual growth, intellectual inquiry, and Christian service.

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion

VMA is committed to creating an inclusive and diverse community, which respects and promotes the integration of underrepresented groups into its community. VMA recognizes the many dimensions of diversity and the broad, complex, and dynamic nature of human difference and similarity. Diversity and inclusion are essential in an educational environment, including preparing students for citizenship in a global society and sharing VMA's mission as a Catholic and IHM congregational school.

Faculty

There are 50 faculty members at Villa Maria, including both religious and lay women and men. The VMA Counseling Department consists of 7 full-time staff members. 86% of Villa Maria's faculty and Counseling Department staff hold a master's degree or higher.

Enrollment

There are 422 female students enrolled in grades 9 through 12 in the 2022-23 academic year. The student-to-faculty ratio is 10 to 1; the average class size is 13.

Accreditation

The school is accredited by the Pennsylvania Association of Independent Schools and Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. Memberships include NAIS, PAIS, ADVIS, NCGS, and National and Pennsylvania Associations for College Admissions Counseling.

College Profile

100% of VMA graduates plan to attend a four-year college or university. The Class of 2022 applied to 210 schools and currently attend 52 different colleges. This class earned a total of more than \$16 million in scholarships.

Academic Profile

VMA requires students to complete a sequence of coursework in Theology, English, Mathematics, Science, World Languages, Social Studies, Fine Arts, Computer Science, Physical Education, Health, and Wellness/Counseling, plus elective courses. They are also required to participate in a Capstone experience that is the broadest application of their learning and research skills. VMA operates on a block schedule with semester and year-end grade reports. In 2022, VMA had 141 AP students; all AP-level students are required to take the AP exam.

Discipline Code

Discipline infractions that result in suspension or expulsion will be reported by VMA to colleges and universities. We will guide our senior students to fully disclose any serious discipline infractions that occur after applications have been submitted to colleges.

Senior Capstone Program

This required program is an inquiry-based experience, driven by student interest. It involves critical thinking, investigative research, problem solving, summarizing findings, and application of prior and acquired knowledge through documented field experience and/or service.

Service Learning Experiential Program

VMA offers local, national, and international service immersion trips, as well as local and regional service opportunities. Service learning occurs through education, prayer, reflection, and action.

Dual Enrollment

Students have the opportunity to earn college credits with Immaculata University. This is suitable for students who have exceeded the high school curriculum offerings.

VMA Scholars Program

This program is an invitation-based opportunity for students who excel on their high school entrance exam and receive an academic scholarship to attend Villa Maria. Students asked to be a part of this program demonstrate the highest level of cognitive aptitude, intellectual curiosity, and a thirst for learning.

Spring 2020, 2020-21 and 2021-2022 Academic Years and Grading

VMA transitioned to virtual learning on March 30, 2020, at the end of the 3rd quarter. Online classes were live and included lectures, class discussions, homework, and assessments. VMA students earned complete, alpha/numeric Semester 2 grades. Normal letter grading was in place for both the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 academic year, with no COVID-related interruptions in the 2021-2022 academic school year.

VMA Hurricane Huddle

This program is designed to foster skills to cultivate a safe and positive school climate, develop healthy relationships with peers and faculty, and create a nurturing environment. Our foundational curriculum is designed to support the student's growth and development through evidence-based methods, with the intention of maximizing the goal that every Villa graduate is confident and ready to navigate the complexities of college and career. The skills addressed and strengthenened include cricital thinking, emotion management, conflict resolution, decision making, and teamwork. The student's particulation in this program will not be reflected on her transcript.

Advanced Placement Program

VMA offers 24 AP courses. Students are limited in the amount of AP courses they can take during grades 9 and 10, and can be limited based on class sizes in grades 11 and 12.

All courses are offered at college preparatory, honors, or advanced placement levels. Students have opportunities to earn additional credits according to their individual needs and future plans.
